What other choice do I have?



Walking is fun and good exercise. But what if I can't walk as far as I want to go? What if it is snowing or raining? What if there are no sidewalks?



Riding my bike is good exercise too. But what if it snows or starts to rain? Is there a bike path and safe streets to ride on where I want to go?



I could call a taxi! But how much will it cost me? Do I have enough money to get there and get back? (A-1 Taxi: 847-888-3990)



Maybe my family can drive me! But what if they are busy or at work? I better plan ahead or it might not work out. These are all great choices sometimes, but is there anything else?





Here are some things that may help you save some money when you use the fixed route system or trains.

<u>Ride Free Permit</u>: You may be able to ride for free on all public transportation in Illinois. Check out the link below to help you find more information.

Reduced Fare Permit: You may be able to ride public transportation for less money. Check out the link below to find more information.

Student Fare: Check out the link below to see how to get a discount.



Fixed Route Bus: that means a bus that almost always takes the same route, day after day, hour after hour. These busses have a time schedule you can use to know when it will arrive. (Elgin has the most fixed routes of our cities in the district. Most of Elgin's busses have a circle route that leaves every 30 minutes.)

Dial-a-Ride: a special bus you call to pick you up if you live close to a fixed route but can't take that bus. Each city has different rules on who can use this program and for what reasons. (we will learn more later)

<u>Para-Transit</u>: another special bus to call if you cant take the fixed route bus. You also have to apply and be ok'd for anyone to use this program.

Each of these costs a different amount of money in each city.

<u>Metra Trains</u>: These are called commuter trains. A commuter is someone who goes from one city to another for work or fun. Most of our trains end up in Chicago with many stops along the way. They then turn back around and go to where they started in the suburbs. They have a time schedule so you know when it comes and goes.

EL Trains: Only the city of Chicago has these Elevated trains. These are small trains that move around on a fixed route like a bus.






